## **17TH ANNUAL GOLF CLASSIC**



# **SPIRITUAL EMPHASIS WEEK**

Spiritual Emphasis Week is a time at CVCS when students are challenged to commit to their faith.

This year's SEW was held Sept. 16-20, and students were tasked with answering this poignant question: "What is your legacy?" The theme of legacy is especially significant with CVCS holding its 50th Anniversary Celebration this year.

Each day was divided into three sessions: K3 through second grade, third through sixth grade, and seventh through twelfth grade. The speakers tailored their messages to the appropriate age groups.

Five speakers shared the podium during the week.

- On Monday, Bible teacher Eli Torres used the example of Moses and how he left a legacy for the nation of Israel.
- On Tuesday, Carl McKee spoke to the students, reminiscing on the time he spent as principal. Mr. McKee was principal at CVCS for 43 years, and he was happy to note that more than 1,000 students have graduated from the school.
- On Wednesday, middle school English teacher Corey Collins shared his testimony about obstacles he had to overcome both as a child and adult and how some traumatic events have shaped his life.
- On Thursday, former student and current Math teacher Kent Lundy talked about his time at CVCS and told students, "You are making a legacy right now," encouraging them to practice accountability.
- On Friday, former student and current Physical Education teacher Logan Carey talked passionately to students about committing to the cause of Christ.



### **SPORTS UPDATE**

The CVCS varsity sports teams are hoping to make a push to do damage in the conference tournaments in October.

In soccer, the Blazers are one of four teams with a chance to win the tournament. At publication time, the Blazers were 3-1 in the Mason Dixon Christian Conference. They seem to be on a level playing field with the other three contenders – Faith, Calvary and Grace.
