

Senior Graduation 2024

"CVCS has provided you with the necessary skills. The emphasis on God, family and country will serve you well. You will succeed when others will fail."

Those encouraging words were delivered by Waynesboro attorney Clint Barkdoll, the guest speaker at Cumberland Valley Christian School's 47th high school commencement. CVCS awarded diplomas to 27 members of the Class of 2024 during the graduation ceremony in the Open Door Church auditorium on May 24. Some highlights:

- Levi Hassinger received the Dino J. Pedrone Award, which carries a \$2,000 scholarship and is awarded to the senior who displays outstanding Christian character. He plans to attend Penn State University and major in Computer Engineering. He compiled a classhigh 1,087 service hours during his four years of high school.
- Hassinger was also valedictorian and in his valedictory address told the graduates, "As we spend our final moments here at CVCS, I want to leave you with this challenge: live your life developing a strong character. As we have learned from the past year, life is full of decisions, and your life path will be carved by the decisions you make." He advised his classmates to make three decisions: to continue to learn, to choose strong priorities, and to live for God, not yourself.

- Liliana Wenger received the Carl G. McKee Scholarship, which also carries a \$2,000 scholarship and is awarded to the senior who excels in Christian service and academics. She plans to attend Shippensburg University and major in political science.
- Wenger, also the class president and salutatorian, welcomed everyone to graduation. In her salutatory address, she challenged her classmates with this: "No matter what you do in life, do it for the honor and glory of God. Never become a stranger to Him and His word, and allow Him to guide your life in all that you do."
- Barkdoll also encouraged the seniors: "Be resilient in the face of adversity ... Dealing with adversity will make you a better person and show you how to treat other people." He added that the key is how they adapt and respond when faced with misfortune.
- CVCS seniors earned more than \$250,000 in scholarships.
- Twelve seniors earned college credits, led by Hassinger, who will have earned 30 college credits by the end of the summer.
- For their class gift, the senior class is presenting 10 new light tables for the Art Room, goal nets and corner flags for the soccer field, several wireless headsets for Drama and Choir, volleyball nets, and a 50th anniversary "Memory Wall" in the high school wing.
